***Contact Hours***

This course is composed of 24 lecture sessions, 3 tutorial sessions and 9 office contact hours. Each lecture session takes 2 contact hours in length; each tutorial session takes 3 contact hours in length; There will be a Q-A review session (3 contact hours) and Final Exam (3 contact hours) at the end of this term. This course has 72 contact hours in total.

***Course Description***

This course is designed specifically for one-semester intermediate French programs. It offers a contextualized review of the fundamentals, adding just enough new material to expand the language skills of French learners without overwhelming them. The course is divided into an in-class conversation manual and an out-of-class grammar reference, giving the flexibility to choose among readings, activities, and grammar practice to meet the varied needs of intermediate students. Regarding to the goal of this course, it is dedicated to offer students' with improved skills in reading, listening, composition and conversation.
