Contact Hours

This course is composed of 24 lecture sessions, 3 tutorial sessions and 9 office contact hours. Each lecture session takes 2 contact hours in length; each tutorial session takes 3 contact hours in length; There will be a Q-A review session (3 contact hours) and Final Exam (3 contact hours) at the end of this term. This course has 72 contact hours in total.

This advanced level language course is designed to further expand and strengthen students' proficiency and communication in Chinese. Reading and writing skills are highlighted to reinforce students' oral comprehension and conversation. The more enthusiastic language learner you are, the easier and better your learning outcomes.

Attending Policy
