Contact Hours

This course is composed of 24 lecture sessions, 3 tutorial sessions and 9 office contact hours. Each lecture session takes 2 contact hours in length; each tutorial session takes 3 contact hours in length; There will be a Q-A review session (3 contact hours) and Final Exam (3 contact hours) at the end of this term. This course has 72 contact hours in total.

Course Description

This course will introduce elementary Japanese language learning. It covers various topics focusing on Japanese grammar, vocabulary, and kanji. In this course, various exercises will be designated to enhance your language skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, for instance, listening comprehension and questions, group situational dialogue, weekly writing and relevant translations and so forth. After completing this course, you can:

1. communicate with others in Japanese in your daily life;
2. master the basic ability to listen, speak, read, write and translate;
3. continue the upper level's learning in Japanese smoothly.
